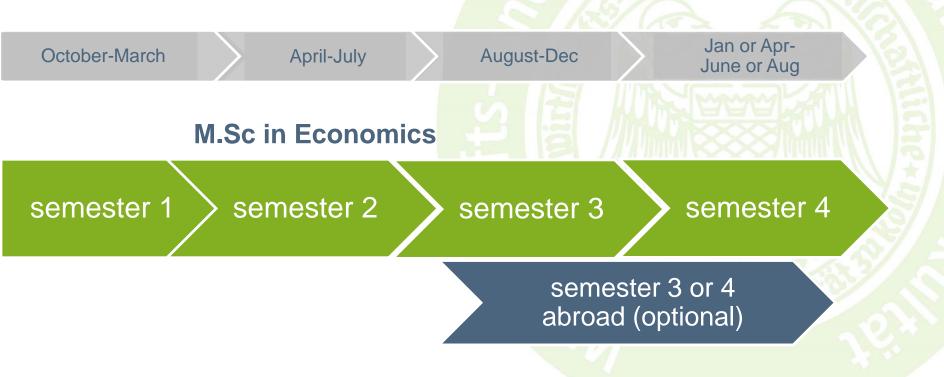
Core and Advanced Section (48 CP): methodological basics

- Cooperation with Cologne Graduate School (CGS)

Research Track



- Close supervision by and frequent feedback from faculty members
- Mentoring by a senior graduate student (second year)
- Participation in the Faculty's research seminars
- Potential cooperation with one of the Faculty's research groups
- Office Space within the CGS
- Preferential consideration for financial support during the PhD stage after successful completion of the Master
- Preferential consideration for optional financial support through a Student Assistant Position during M.Sc. phase





Admission requirements

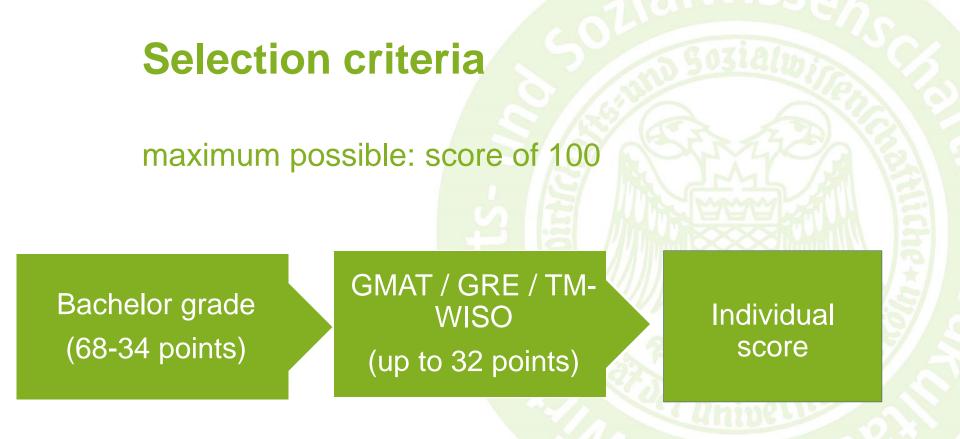
- Bachelor's degree (finished or at least earned 80% of the required degree CP)
- Overall grade of at least 2.7 (German grade)
- at least 48 CP in Business Administration, Economics and/or Social Scoiences
- at least 18 CP in Economics
- at least 15 CP in Statistics/Mathematics

Language requirements

• English level B2: e.g. TOEFL 87 ibt







- The above criteria are used to determine an individual score for each applicant.
- Study places are subsequently allocated according to the applicant's position on the ranking list.





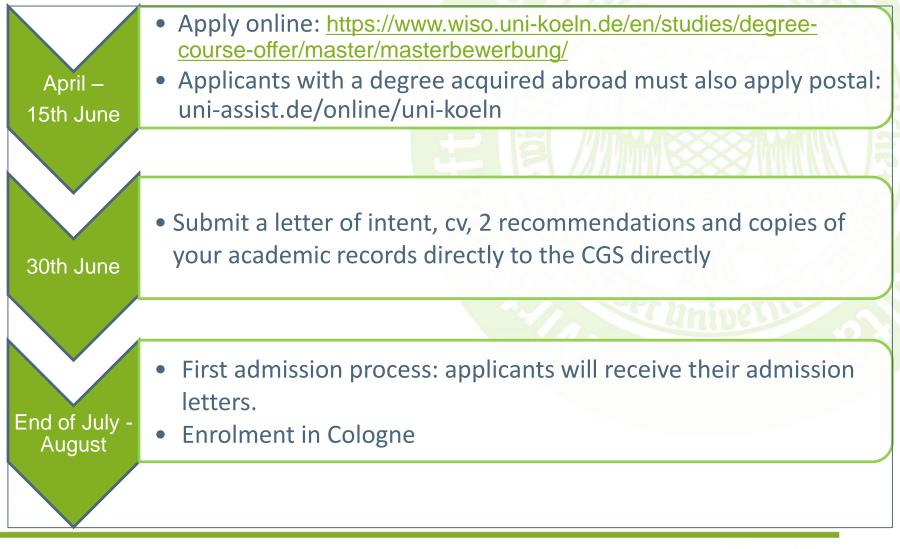
Application process Economics







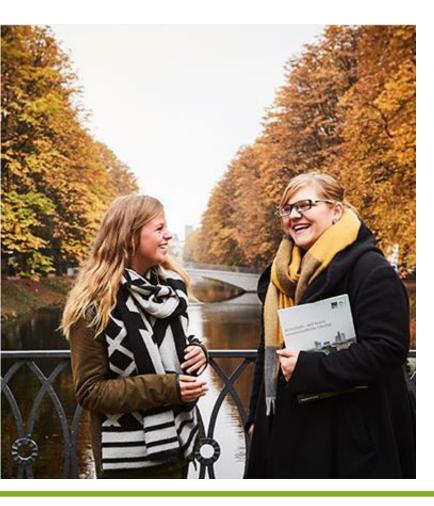
Application process Economics as Research Track
