Why Political Science (at UoC)?

- Understand Political Science as a whole
- Our Master's programme makes you an general expert in Political Science
- Programme allows students to choose following fields:
 - Comparative Analysis of Political Institutions
 - Comparative Analysis of Political Economies
 - Political Theory and the History of Ideas
 - International Relations
 - European Politics
 - -> no compulsory (except colloquium),
 freedom and responsibility of choice













Why Political Science (at UoC)?

- Opportunity to choose module in Economics and a variety of modules from the Philosophy Faculty within the Supplementary Section:
 - Anthropology
 - Languages and Cultures of the Islamic World
 - Media Studies
 - History
- Opportunity to transfer credits achieved abroad within the Supplementary Section (12 or the full 24 ECTS in this category)













Why Political Science (at UoC)?

- Internationality and networking
- Offers opportunity to future PhD-studies
- Qualifies for (inter)national thematically wide spread occupations for political scientists
- Possible areas of employment, e.g.:
 - Administration and state institutions, political parties, political foundations and associations
 - International and non-government organizations
 - Public law and private media enterprises

Admission requirements

- Bachelor's degree (finished or at least earned 80% of the required degree
 CP)
- Overall grade of at least 2.7 (German grade)
- At least 30 CP in the field of Political Science
- At least 12 further CP in Political Science and/or Methodology and/or Empirical Social Research

Language requirements

- English level B2, e.g. TOEFL 87 ibt
- **DMP**: English level C1, e.g. TOEFL 100 ibt

Selection Criteria: Motivation letter (German or English)











Selection criteria

Bachelor grade (1,0 - 2,7 German grade system)

Last year's score: 2,5

- The procedure is based on the grade earned in the Bachelor's degree
- If the number of applicants meeting the admission criteria exceeds the number of places available for this course of study, a selection procedure is initiated for the purpose of ranking these applicants

- First admission process: selected applicants will receive their admission letters.
- Enrolment in Cologne

- Two Master's degrees












Political Science as Double Master's programme

- For applicants who have not obtained their bachelor's degree in Germany or at Maastricht University: 1 May 2017
- -> Please apply online

At Maastricht University:

- For EU applicants: 1 June 2017
- For non-EU applicants: 1 May 2017
