Why Sociology & SR (at UoC)?

- Cologne is a center of sociology in Germany and internationally -> Institute of Sociology and Social Psychology (ISS)
- Long tradition: founded in 1918 and the oldest institution of sociological research in Germany
- "Cologne School": Groundbreaking role in promoting and developing quantitative methods in the social sciences since the 1960s
- Theory-driven (quantitative) empirical research













Why Sociology (at UoC)?

- Advanced courses in empirical methods and statistics (data collection and data analysis)
- 2-term Research seminar within the Specialisation section credited with 15 CP
- Opportunity to transfer credits achieved abroad within the Supplementary section (12 or the full 24 CP in this category)
- Degree: M.Sc.













Why Sociology (at UoC)?

- Offers opportunity to future PhD-studies
- Many opportunities for practical experiences in private and public research institutes
- Key qualifications in data collection and analysis that are demanded and rewarded on the labor market (e.g. in market and opinion research, (inter)national statistics offices, research institutions)

Master's thesis (30 CP)

Specialisation section (39 CP):

Research seminar, sociological theories, social structure and social inequality, social change, migration...

Supplementary section (24

CP): e.g. in the fields of advanced social research, econometrics, design&behavior, social psychology...

Core and Advanced Section (27 CP):

methodological and content-specific basics in e.g. analysis of cross-sectional data, longitudinal data, special analysis modules

Admission requirements

- Bachelor's degree (finished or at least earned 80% of the required degree CP)
- Overall grade of at least 2.7 (German grade)
- At least 30 CP in the field of Sociology
- At least 18 further CP in quantitative methods in Social Sciences or Empirical Social Research, within these credits at least 9 CP in Statistics have to be included
- Only DMP: Very good intercultural and social skills and relevant practical experience is desirable for this programme

Language requirements

- English level B2, e.g. TOEFL 87 ibt
- **DMP**: English level C1, e.g. TOEFL 100 ibt











Selection criteria for Sociology & SR

Bachelor grade (1,0 - 2,7 German grade system)

Last year's score: 2,7

- The procedure is based on the grade earned in the Bachelor's degree
- If the number of applicants meeting the admission criteria exceeds the number of places available for this course of study, a selection procedure is initiated for the purpose of ranking these applicants

- First admission process: selected applicants will receive their admission letters.

- Two Master's degrees












Sociology as Double Master's programme

Application process Sociology as DMP

Application deadlines:

- For applicants with a German bachelor's degree or a bachelor's degree from the University of Groningen: 15 May 2017
- For applicants who have not acquired their bachelor's degree in Germany or at the University of Groningen: 1 May 2017
- Applicants that are shortlisted after assessment of the written application will be invited for a personal interview to the University of Cologne in June
- If your application for the Double Master's Programme has not been successful, your application may still be considered for the regular M.Sc. in Sociology and Social Research at the University of Cologne
